Websites shift from menus to search engines, emphasizing quick searches and efficient navigation, especially on smaller screens.

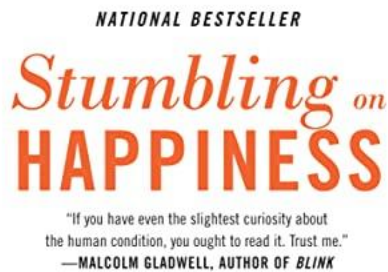
